RULES AND GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION

1. Exhibitors must be no older than age 21 on show day.
2. No substitutions allowed. Each exhibitor must show their own animal unless he/she is showing more than one animal in the same class. Exhibitors must own animals or be actively involved in the long-term daily care of the animal. If animal is registered, a copy of registration form must be available if requested on show day.
3. All animals entered from out of state will be required to have health papers and permit number. No health papers are needed on in-state animals.
4. **Divisions for Heifers**
Heifers must be born after July 1, 2008. This allows for entry of fall born heifers. Heifers will be shown by breed and all breeds participating will be represented. Heifers will be split into classes based on age. The Overall Grand and Reserve Grand Champions of the combined breed show will receive an additional \$250 and \$100 respectively.
Divisions for Market Steers
Classes will be split according to weight. Must be weighed-in by 10:00 am on June 20. An Overall Grand and Reserve Champion steer will be chosen from the top two winners in each class. They will receive an additional \$250 and \$100 respectively.
Divisions for Cow/Calf Pairs
Calves must be born in 2010. Cows can be any age. Pairs will be shown by breed and all breeds participating will be represented. An Overall Grand and Reserve Champion pair will be chosen from the top two winners in each breed. They will receive an additional \$100 and \$50 respectively.
Divisions for Breeding Ewes
Ewes will be shown by breeds and split into classes based on age. Champions and Reserves will be selected in each age group and then the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected from those animals. The Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Ewes of the combined breed show will receive an additional \$75 and \$50 respectively.
Divisions for Market Lambs
Classes will first be divided by sex and then weight of the animal. Must be weighed-in by 10:00 am on June 20. The Grand and Reserve Overall Champions of the Market Lamb show will receive an additional \$150 and \$75 respectively.
Divisions for Dairy Goats
Does will be shown by breeds and split into classes based on age. Champions and Reserves will be selected in each age group and then the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected from those animals. The Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Does of the combined breed show will receive an additional \$75 and \$50 respectively.
Divisions for Meat Goats
Does will be shown by breeds and split into classes by age. Champions and Reserves will be selected in each age group and then the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected from those animals. The Overall Grand and Reserve Champion does of the combined breed show will receive an additional \$75 and \$50 respectively.
Divisions for Market Goats
Classes will first be divided by sex and then weight of the animal. Must be weighed-in by 10:00 am on June 20. The Grand and Reserve Overall Champions of the Market Goat show will receive an additional \$150 and \$75 respectively.
Divisions for Breeding Gilts
Breeding Gilts will be shown by breed and split into classes based on age. The Overall Grand and Reserve Champion of the Breeding Gilt Show will receive an additional \$75 and \$50 respectively.

Divisions for Market Hogs

Classes will first be divided by sex and then weight of the animal. Must be weighed-in by 10:00 am on June 20. The Grand and Reserve Overall Champions of the Market Hog show will receive an additional \$150 and \$75 respectively.

Divisions for Rabbits

Classes will be divided on show day based upon the number of entries. When registering rabbits, age classification will be as follows: Junior rabbits are 3-5 months of age, Intermediate are 6-8 months, and Senior are over 8 months. Best in Show and Reserve in Show will receive an additional \$35 and \$20 respectively.

Showmanship Classes

Each species will have a showmanship class. Exhibitors will be divided into two divisions for showmanship. Age 13 and under will be considered juniors while seniors will be age 14 and over. Prizes will be awarded to the winners of the showmanship divisions.

Peewee Livestock Show

All children age 8 and under are welcome to participate. Animals are provided for the kids to use, but they are welcome to bring their own animal as well. The purpose of the class is to allow novice or inexperienced young showmen the opportunity to show an animal. Classes will not be officially ranked. Participation prizes will be awarded to all children that participate.

5. The Northwest Junior Show Committee reserves the right to change the class breakdown for each species based upon the number of entries present on show day.
6. Entries must be postmarked by Monday, June 7, 2010. The entry fee must accompany each entry form. Forms received without entry fees will be assessed the late fee at check in time. All entry fee monies will be returned to exhibitors in the form of premiums. Stalling is available on the fairgrounds. Livestock may begin arrival at 12:00 pm on Saturday, June 19. **All livestock must be on the fairgrounds by 10:00 am Sunday, June 20 and remain until 6:00 pm unless prior arrangements have been made with the show committee.** Late entries will be accepted until 10:00 am Sunday, June 20. Late entry fee will be \$20 for beef and \$15 for sheep, swine and goats, and \$2 for rabbits.
7. To promote an attractive and safe stall area, **show management asks that no butt fans be used.**

11. Camping: Free camping is available on the fairgrounds. Shower facilities available at the Flaxton Community Hall.

13. Service Stations: There are no gas stations in Flaxton, ND. The closest stations are in Lignite (10 miles) or Bowbells (14 miles).

**14. IAFE (International Association of Fairs and Expositions)
National Code of Show Ring Ethics**

All exhibitors in any event at a livestock show will at all times conduct themselves with honor, honesty and good sportsmanship. Those who violate the Code of Ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds, and be prohibited from future exhibition.

1. When requested by show officials, be able to show proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered.
2. When requested by show officials, provide animal health certificates from a licensed veterinarian.
3. Junior exhibitors will care for and groom their own animals while at the fair or show.
4. Animals which will enter the food chain must be free of drug residues or foreign substances. For all animals, drugs may only be used in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial laws. Any treatments at the show involving medications for the health of the animal must be administered by a licensed veterinarian. Show management or regulatory officials may take any samples they wish for testing.
5. Changing the animals performance, natural contour, conformation, or appearance through surgery, injection or application of substances such as irritants or counter-irritants is prohibited.
6. Showing and handling practices or devices to cause swelling are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors or breed representatives is prohibited at all times. Problems will be resolved through appropriate channels.
8. No one may conspire, contribute to or cooperate with others to violate this code, either by their action or inaction.
9. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and participants are absolutely responsible for an animals condition whether or not they did something in violation themselves or knew of treatment that violates the code.
10. Exhibitors upon entry consent to disciplinary action for violation of the Code of Show Ring Ethics, including publishing the infraction and violator's names.
11. Exhibitors verify that they have read and understand the Code of Ethics, as well as the consequences and penalties for violations. Exhibitors understand that evidence of violation of any law will be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities.
